Students and staff were invited to wear purple earlier this month as we brought awareness to Rett Syndrome, a rare genetic disorder.





### **Early Childhood Center (ECC)**

ECC has had a wonderful and busy start to our school year and we are excited to be back! We are working hard on using our voices, learning about the seasons, working towards our goals, making science predictions for experiments, and even taking a trip to a local orchard.

In science, we explored the properties of pumpkins (how they look, how they feel, if they are heavy or light, if they sink or float, etc) and then had the chance to go to Terhune Orchards and learn about how pumpkins grow and get to pick our own pumpkins! During reading, we have explored the changing of the season from summer to autumn and the things we can see and feel that indicate that change. We even explored with a leaf scavenger hunt outside around the school.

Additionally, we had the traveling farm come to Rock Brook and both students and staff loved petting and looking at the farm animals!! We can't wait to keep learning and keep growing this year!



## Elementary


This month we learned all about pumpkins and their life cycles. We took a field trip to Terhune Orchards where we learned about apple trees, picked pumpkins, and learned all about who does what on the farm. We also discussed people's needs and compared how they are different from pumpkins.

We are practicing answering and asking wh- questions. The most fun way is by playing HeadBandz. When answering questions, we give two verbal answer options as needed. When asking questions we use visuals to show which wh-questions we are asking about.

We also have a haunted house in our speech corner where students can decorate the haunted house. There are 6 windows and when the students open the window they answer a question based on their goals.

Elementary loved the traveling farm!! We worked on expanding our sentences and using descriptors.
